CAPACITY STRENGTHENING


Through a series of training workshops, knowledge exchange events, a visiting research fellow programme, a mentoring scheme and small grants fund, we hope to create a strong network of urban researchers specialised in neighbourhood analysis of rapidly urbanising cities.

INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH

Our international team of researchers are conducting a **comparative study** of urbanisation and differentiation of neighbourhoods in 14 different cities in both emerging economies and relatively poor countries in Africa and Asia, including: **Bangladesh**, **China**, the **Philippines**, **Rwanda**, **South Africa** and **Tanzania**.

EXAMPLES OF EDUCATION ISSUES AND QUESTIONS

How do neighbourhoods shape educational opportunity, both in schools and beyond?

How are spatial inequalities perpetuated or interrupted by schools and other educational institutions?

How is education valued by residents of different neighbourhoods, and how do their educational choices reflect this?

Methods: mapping, policy review, household survey, qualitative focus groups
